Baltic Worlds' Special Issue on Romani Studies:

Roma in the Balkan area: past, present and future

Baltic Worlds is a scholarly, multidisciplinary publication, with international distribution that covers the vast area of the Baltic Sea Region, East Europe as well as Russia and the post-socialist states in Caucasus and Balkan. The journal *Baltic Worlds* is published by the Centre for Baltic and East European Studies (CBEES) at Södertörn University, and is financed by funds made available by the Östersjöstiftelsen (Baltic Sea Foundation).

Baltic Worlds will publish in 2018 a Special Issue on Romani Studies, edited by **Dr. Julieta Rotaru** (Muzeul Național al Literaturii Române, Bucharest) and **Professor Kimmo Granqvist** (Södertörn University, Stockholm). We welcome articles dealing with Romani paradigm of living in the Balkan area: past, present and future. With the Balkan area we include, not only former Yugoslavia, but also Romania, Bulgaria and Hungary. The articles can represent any relevant discipline in Romani Studies, e.g. History, Political Sciences, Anthropology / Ethnology, Philology, or Linguistics. Manuscripts should preferably be in English. Final version of manuscripts are to be delivered in English, if not agreed otherwise.

The volume will comprise five selected peer-reviewed articles not exceeding 8,000 words each, including abstract and keywords. In addition to the peer-reviewed articles, we will include in the volume interviews of prominent scholars with Roma background.

A prerequisite for publishing scientific articles in the *Baltic Worlds* is that the article not already be published in English elsewhere. All material is reviewed by two independent specialists. If an article is simultaneously being considered by another publication, this should be indicated.

Before you send in your article, kindly read our [Style Guide](#) and follow the instructions.

1. Indicate the title of the article, name(s) of the author(s), and the address to which the editorial staff should send correspondence on a separate page.
2. Give a brief description of yourself separately, with title, subject area, and any work and/or activities that might be of relevance.
3. *Baltic Worlds* practice double blind peer-review by two anonymous, independent reviewers, at least at post-doc level, following the reviewers' guidelines.
